

Standards for Boys

Shirts

- Any Oasis-themed T-shirt or Polo is permissible any day of the week, otherwise, all shirts must have a collar, long or short sleeves, be loose fitting, be either polo or oxford style, and may be worn with only the top button unbuttoned. Other polos with college or professional teams and appropriate brands (ex. Nike, Polo, Adidas) are acceptable.
- No shirts with secular bands or singers, political statements, racial statements, or inappropriate slogans

Pants

- Boys must wear solid, cotton, "khaki style" pants, or blue jeans. Elementary students may wear knee length "khaki style" shorts.
- All pants and blue jeans must be worn at the waist. Students who do not abide by this will be required to wear a belt.
- Jeans must be in good repair. Modern style jeans are permissible, any holes must be patched, and no skin can be visible through the holes.

Shoes

- Boys must wear closed toe, closed-heeled shoes. Flip flops, or any other type of sandals are not permitted.
- Secondary Students may wear crocs as long as the strap is on the back (sport mode)

Jacket & Coats

- Students may wear sweaters, coats, jackets, varsity jackets, and raincoats to school. Students may wear zip-up jackets with hoods.
- Oasis, College or Professional Sports Teams, and appropriate branded (ex. Nike, Polo, Adidas) hoodies and sweatshirts are acceptable. Clothing worn under hoodies or sweatshirts must be an Oasis-themed t-shirt or a collared shirt. Hoodies representing other high schools are not allowed.
- No hoodies with secular bands or singers, political statements, racial statements, or inappropriate slogans.

General Appearance

- All hair should be neat and well groomed. No distracting hair styles. Only natural/ethnic hair colors allowed.
- Hair must be kept out of the eyes.
- No ponytails, mohawks, excessive spikes, are allowed. The administration reserves the right to address other hairstyles that are deemed inappropriate for school on an individual basis.
- Sideburns must be well groomed.
- Facial hair will be allowed for 9th - 12th grade boys and must be well groomed at all times - no excuses. Boys who are not well groomed will be asked to correct the issue and grooming will be checked the following day.
- Boys are NOT permitted to wear earrings while at school, on campus, or while attending school functions, including sports events/practices. In addition, no plastic posts may be worn under any circumstance.
- Students may not have any visible tattoos, body art, or body piercings.
- Hats and/or sunglasses may not be worn inside the school building.

- Excessive use of hygiene products in the classroom or classroom grooming is not permitted.
- Boys are NOT permitted to wear makeup or nail polish.

Standards for Girls

Shirts

- Shirts must not be made of transparent material. Spaghetti straps or midriffs are not allowed.
- Oasis-themed T-shirt or Polo is permissible any day of the week as well as other polos with college or professional teams and appropriate branded (ex. Nike, Polo, Adidas).
- No shirts with secular bands or singers, political statements, racial statements, or inappropriate slogans.

Pants

- Girls must wear loose fitting (not baggy) solid, cotton, any color "khaki style" pants, jeans, or capris. Elementary students may wear any color "khaki style" knee length shorts.
- All pants, capris, and knee length shorts must be worn at the waist. Students who do not abide by this will be required to wear a belt.
- Jeans must be in good repair. Modern style jeans are permissible, any holes must be patched, and no skin can be visible through the holes. Embroidered designs are permissible as long as they are not offensive.
- Skirts, Dresses, Leggings, jeggings, knit pants, or other tight-fitting pants are not permissible.

Shoes

- Girls must wear closed toe, closed-heeled shoes. Flip flops, or any other types of sandals are not permitted.
- Secondary students may wear Crocs as long as the strap is on the back (Sport mode). No platform shoes or heels are permitted.

Jacket & Coats

- Students may wear sweaters, coats, jackets, varsity jackets, and raincoats to school. Students may wear zip-up jackets with hoods.
- Oasis, Colleges, Professional Sports Teams, Appropriate branded (ex. Nike, Polo, Adidas) hoodies and sweatshirts are acceptable. Clothing worn under hoodies or sweatshirts must be an Oasis-themed shirt or a collared shirt. Hoodies representing other high schools are not allowed.
- No hoodies with secular bands or singers, political statements, racial statements, or inappropriate slogans.

General Appearance

- All hair should be neat and well groomed. Only natural/ethnic hair colors are allowed. Modest highlighting and hair colors that compliment a student are permitted. No

mohawks, feathers, excessive spikes. The administration reserves the right to address other hairstyles that are deemed inappropriate for school.

- Make-up is permitted for girls but must be applied moderately and be natural in appearance.
- Nail polish is permitted except for black polish.
- Girls are not to apply make-up or nail polish during class.
- Girls are permitted to wear earrings. No gauges.
- Students may not have any visible tattoos, body art, or body piercings.
- Nose rings or other jewelry requiring body piercing are not permitted. In addition, no plastic posts may be worn under any circumstance.
- Hats and/or sunglasses may not be worn inside the school building.
- Excessive use of hygiene products in the classroom or classroom grooming is not permitted.

Note: Final authority regarding dress code interpretation rests with the principal or Head of School.

During 4th quarter, seniors may wear t-shirts of colleges/universities where they have been accepted. Students must provide a copy of the acceptance letter to the administration.

Unfortunately, many brand names come up with slogans that push the envelope of appropriateness (such as a hunting clothing line with the slogan "Bucked Up" on it as an example). These items are not permitted to be worn at school. If you are unsure of the appropriateness, please discuss this with the secondary principal prior to wearing the shirt in question.

Penalty for non-compliance of Dress Code

- If the infraction violates our safety, modesty, or appropriateness to situation guidelines, the principal will communicate the problem and attempt to obtain the appropriate clothes. If clothing cannot be brought the student will be assigned a detention.
- If clothing can be brought, after five uniform infraction behavior logs a detention will be assigned to the student.
- Exceptions to this rule must be approved by administration.
