ELEM Dress Code

Students are expected to comply with the dress code and parents are expected to monitor compliance before their children leave home. Final authority regarding dress code interpretation rests with the administration and is not subject to appeal.

Our ultimate goal is to focus on the heart of our students. To maintain a biblical emphasis and create an orderly learning environment, a student dress code has been established. It has three guiding principles: safety, modesty, and appropriateness for the event. Within these guiding principles, our dress code encourages students to show their originality and express who they are.

Parents will be notified of dress code violations and a uniform fraction will be written. After five infractions the student will serve a detention. Please partner with us by reviewing your student's dress before he/she leaves home.

Clothing with logos or slogans that push the envelope or are questionable are NOT permitted.

Unfortunately, many brand names come up with slogans that push the envelope of appropriateness (such as a hunting clothing line with the slogan "Bucked Up" on it as an example). These items are not permitted to be worn at school. If you are unsure of the appropriateness, please discuss this with the elementary principal prior to wearing the shirt in question.
